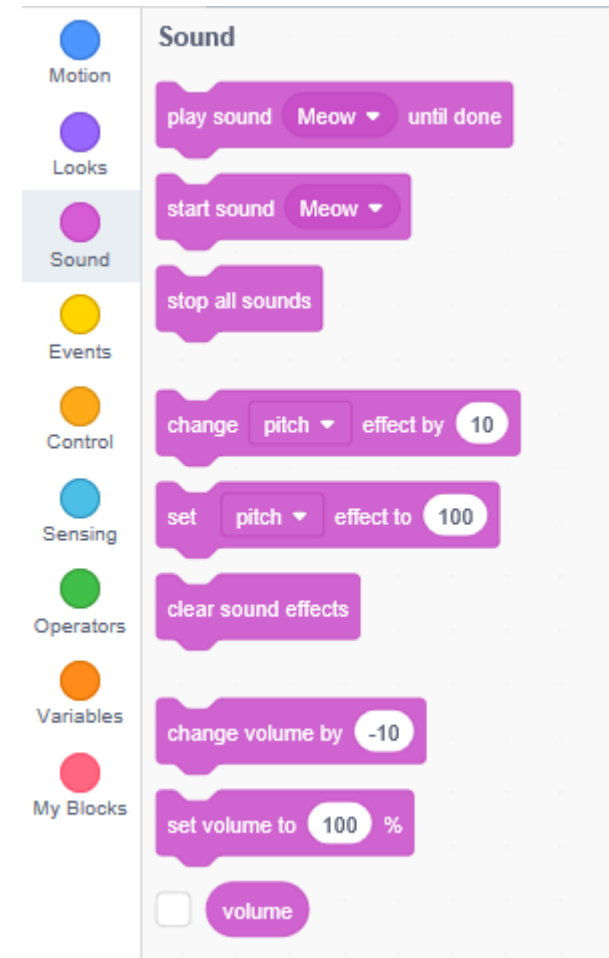
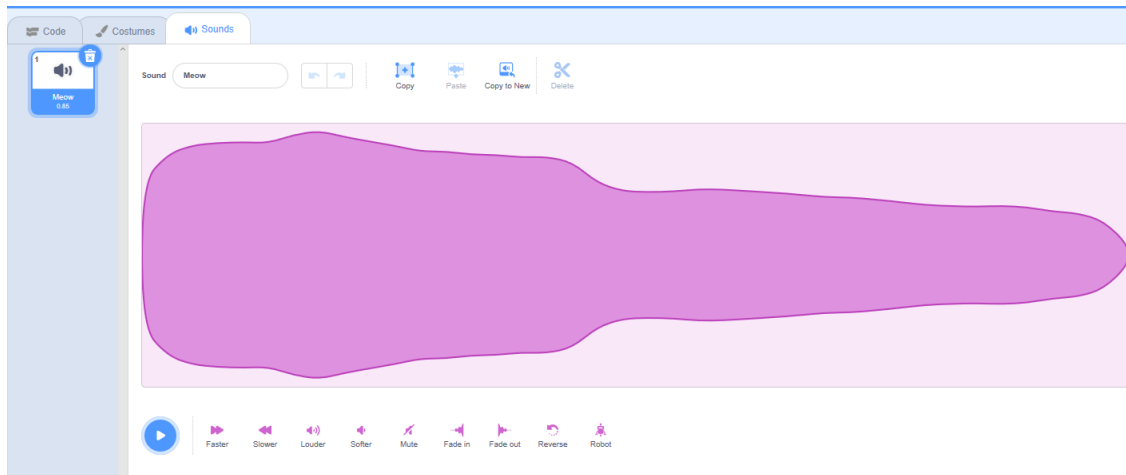


Making Music

Scratch project

Using sound blocks

There are several tools available to you when making music with Scratch. The purple 'sounds' tab houses all of the blocks relating to music and sound effects. They can be built into anywhere in your project that would benefit from audio.

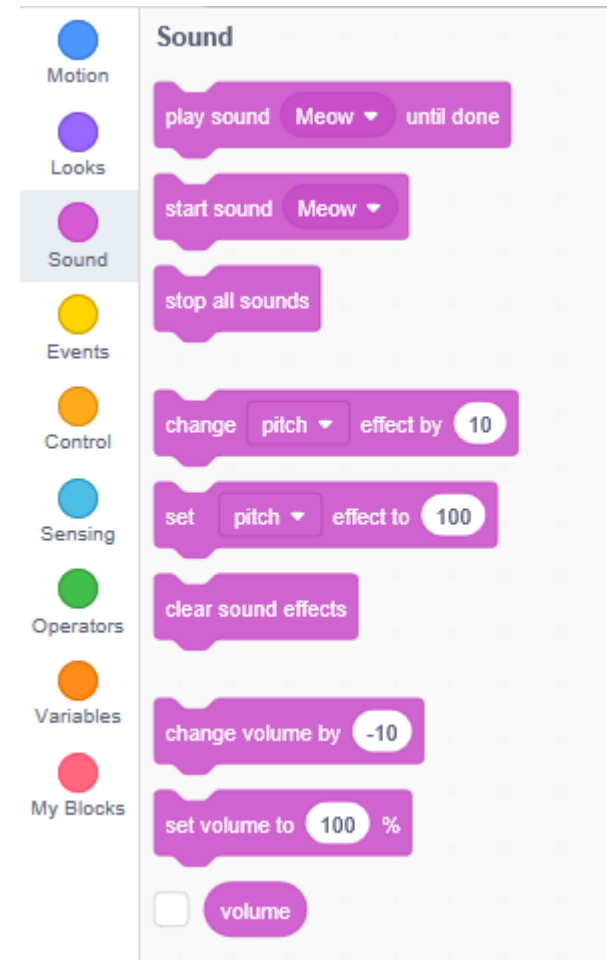


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Using sound blocks

The sounds tab will allow you to scroll through the sound library and select, edit and even record your own sounds for your project to suit your needs.



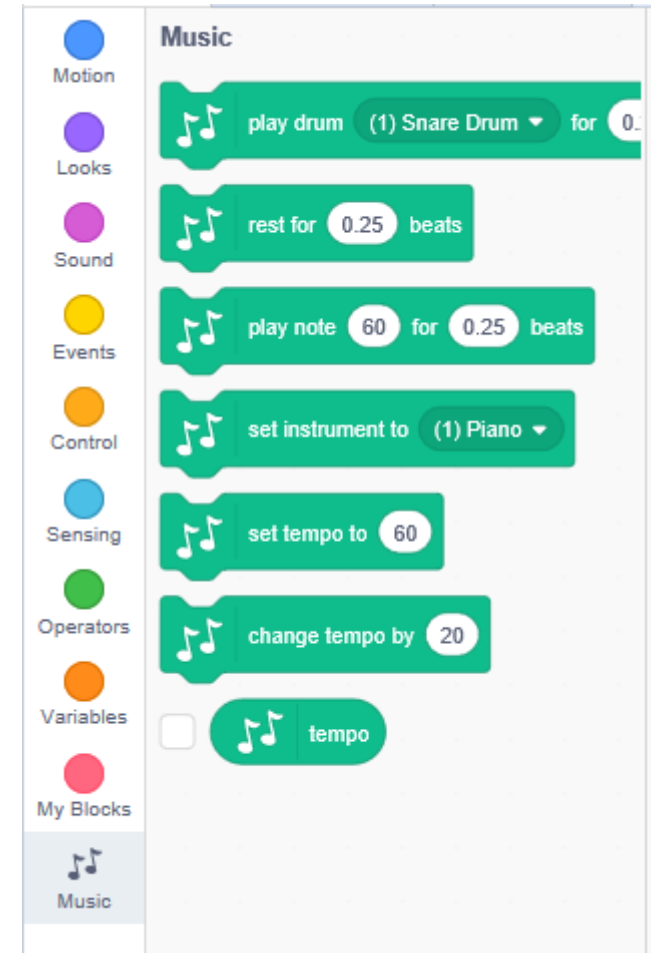
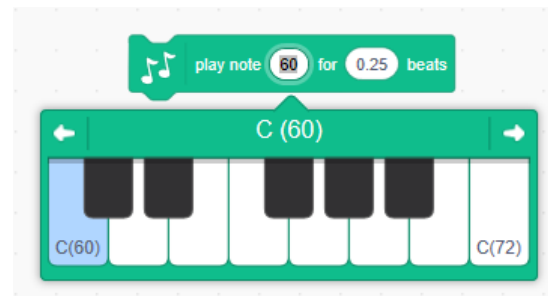
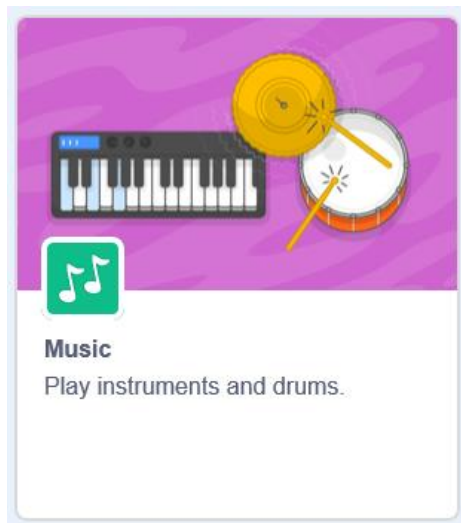
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Using the music extension

The music extension adds 7 more blocks to your library to enable you to build more complex and creative musical programmes.

Where the sound library only gives access to notes relating to nine of the musical instrument sprites, the new 'set instrument to' block allows you to choose from over 21 musical instruments, and the 'play drum' block adds 10 percussion instruments to the library to be played with.
